Introduction

Welcome to this introduction to Disgraced, a Pulitzer Prize-winning play by Ayad Akhtar, presented by Singapore Repertory Theatre.

The audio described performance is at 2pm on Sunday, 1 September 2024, and runs for about 90 minutes with no intermission. Please note that the rating for Disgraced is R18 for mature themes. Synopsis

Located in a spacious Upper East Side apartment in New York, Amir has worked hard to achieve the American Dream. With South Asian Muslim roots, he has gone on to become a successful lawyer, has a beautiful American wife and even a wardrobe of \$600 custom-tailored shirts.

But when Amir hosts a dinner party for his African American colleague and her Jewish husband, the initially pleasant evening erupts into a volatile argument over race, religion and class in the modern world.

Set in post 9/11 America, Disgraced is a journey exploring the clash between modernity and faith.

Cast, characters and costume

The show features five main characters. Amir, his wife Emily, his colleague Jory, Jory's husband Issac and Amir's nephew, Abe.

Amir is played by Ghafir Akbar. An American corporate lawyer of South Asian origin, he first appears in a black suit jacket, a crisp white collared shirt complete with a black tie and white pocket square, but with only black boxer shorts and white socks underneath all of that. He later dresses up with his pants and into other outfits.

Simone Policano plays Emily, Amir's Caucasian wife. A passionate artist, she first appears in blue jeans and a blue striped long sleeved top over a white halter top. Her hair is held up in a claw clip.

Issac is played by Jeremy Rishe. A Jewish American art curator married to Jory, he is dressed fashionably in a stone coloured ensemble including a polo shirt, suit jacket and pants. His outfit is finished off with a navy pocket square and black Oxford shoes.

Jory is played by Eboni Flowers. Married to Issac, she is an African American corporate lawyer and Amir's colleague. She wears a black sleeveless dress, coat and heels as well as gold jewelry pieces. Her braids are secured in an elegant up-do.

Shrey Bhargava plays Abe, Amir's Pakistani American nephew. He is dressed like any American teenager with a white printed T-shirt, dark blue jeans, a navy hoodie with white accents and white high top sneakers.

Set and Setting

Disgraced is set in Amir's and Emily's home, an Upper East Side apartment in New York City, USA. The apartment has contemporary furnishings that are a blend of the minimalist and industrial styles. The apartment is also decorated with art books and a mix of ethnic and vintage artifacts.

Their home has an apartment door and living room on the left with the dining area and a swinging kitchen door on the right. In the back there are two gray double doors with divided windows on the left and right that open to a balcony.

The gray entrance door opens to a living room with dark blue walls and gray marbled wallpaper. Beside the entrance, there is a wooden coat stand with various jackets and coats on it. Against the wall behind the coat stand is a marbled gray fireplace with an exposed silver metal chimney.

Next to the fireplace is a white sofa, a white ottoman and a coffee table made of wood and black metal frames. Behind, in the right corner of the living room, is a black metal shelf which serves as a bar stocked with different types of alcohol.
