A Super Happy Story (About Feeling Super Sad) tackles a subject that is unfortunately far too prevalent today, particularly in young people: depression. What makes this production stand out is its innovative approach - using music, song, dance, and humour to tackle such a serious topic. At the heart of Hidayat's work lies his deep love for sound design. He approaches each project as a canvas, using sound as his paintbrush to create immersive and unforgettable auditory experiences. His meticulous attention to detail ensures that every note, tone, and sound effect resonates perfectly with the production's narrative, enhancing the audience's emotional connection to the performances.

Offstage, Hidayat continues to explore the endless possibilities of sound, constantly pushing boundaries and expanding his creative horizons. His dedication to the art of sound design is not just a profession; it's a lifelong passion that enriches the world of theatre and leaves a lasting impact on all who have the pleasure of experiencing his work. Pat Jon Gregory Choreographer

Born in the Philippines and raised in Singapore, Pat Jon Gregory is a performing artiste, choreographer and musical theatre educator.

His performance training under the BA(Hons) musical theatre programme at LASALLE College of the Arts has helped him to integrate his dance, acting and singing skills together - allowing him to discover various mediums for storytelling.
